Corporations for Education (CFE) Funding Criteria

Objective: To clearly define the programs and projects of particular interest for CFE funding

Purpose: To address collective and cooperative education concerns identified by corporate demand on employees and school administration's goals to meet and exceed academic standards

Eligibility: Any program or initiative that supports and/or enhances academic excellence for P-H-M students or professional development for administrators, teachers and staff of the P-H-M School Corporation

Funding Categories:

CFE Partner Initiated Projects —Projects originated from the CFE committee or a CFE partner. Programs or initiatives will likely be created with the guidance and direction of said CFE representative or committee.

P-H-M Administration Initiated Projects —Projects or initiatives for funding are presented by the Superintendent or his/her administrative representative.

Executive Director Referred Projects — Project presented by the Executive Director after being scrutinized and deemed worthy of CFE funding consideration by one or more of the following: Executive Committee, CFE Chair, and Executive Director.

Funding Request Requirements:

All funding requests must:

- ✓ Be typewritten
- ✓ Demonstrate creativity and innovation in educational programming
- ✓ Indicate purpose for the project and identified need
- ✓ Have clearly defined goals, objectives, and proposed outcomes
- ✓ Indicate the number of P-H-M students, staff or administrators that will benefit
- ✓ Include a detailed budget including other sources of funding for the project (if applicable)
- ✓ Be written to be understood by non-educators

Funding Recipient Requirements:

- ✓ Provide the CFE committee with updates on program progress and outcomes
- ✓ Document program progress by taking digital photos or video of their program/project, along with Parent Release forms for those students being photographed, for submission to PHMEF's CFE Committee
- ✓ Submit a final report upon completion of the program/project or annually for ongoing programs

CFE Funding Announcements:

Funding requests will be reviewed by the CFE committee. The CFE committee generally meets on a monthly basis. Recipients will be notified by phone within 5 business days after the committee approves the funding request.

Accessing CFE Funds Awarded

When a project is funded, PHMEF will send the funds to the recipient's school Principal or the Superintendent in the case of a professional development or other administrative funding request. Funds are then accessed by submitting expense receipts to the Principal or Superintendent's office whichever the case may be.
