products to replace existing keyboards. Requesting a higher quality keyboard product that will last longer. It may be necessary to purchase a lower quantity to get a better product that is serviceable by school partners. Foundation willing to support a purchase up to \$10,000.

- Awarded \$1,000
- Funds to purchase basic self-care and hygiene products (soap, hair products, deodorant, etc.)

Greenhouse will also serve as a Conservation Project and house sustainable plants. Project supported in partnership with McKinley Garden Center.

- o Awarded \$1,000
- Students are required to design, build and refine a device that converts one form of energy into another form of energy. Students will construct a simple AC generator using Neodymium batteries and magnets as well as build dye-sensitized solar cells to harvest sunlight into electricity.

 Purchase of TD Snap app for iPads. The program is a voice output communication aid that allows nonverbal students with autism and/or other disabilities (i.e. speech impairments) to increase communication skills.

13. Band Room Sound System Project

- Modernize technology within the school band room to purchase two QSC speakers including an amplifier and necessary accessories. Will allow students to have an improved learning environment with clearer sound and allows classes to connect with media platforms that enhance student performances.

- o All 9-12 grade students
- Awarded \$2,170.70
- Purchase MyGardyn 3.0 to cultivate edible plants within Penn to support students facing food insecurity. Also provides hands-on learning experiences for Agriculture Students, Plant Club, Key Club, Environmental Awareness Club and Biology students who will participate in the growing and harvesting of plants.

- Awarded \$2,590.21
- Provides materials to launch a student-led coffee shop. Peer leader non-disabled students will
 work alongside students in the EATC employability skills group. Cultivates friendships between
 Ex Ed and Gen Ed students and helps build life and leadership skills to continue to foster an
 inclusive culture at Grissom.

16. Empowering Learners: The Beebots & Coding Adventure

- o All K-5th grade students
- o Awarded \$809.95
- Purchase six Beebots, a charging station and coding mats to bring innovation and hands-on learning into the classrooms. Introduces foundations of computer programming allowing teachers to transform traditional lessons into engaging, interactive experiences fostering critical thinking, problem-solving and teamwork amongst students.

17. Visual Aid Projector

- o Students in American Sign Language Classes

- Awarded \$1,577
- Purchase a second projector in the ASL room that allows student presenters to reference the screen on the other side of the room when presenting. Unlike other presentations, students are not able to reference their presentation slides when doing ASL so the projector will support confidence in student presentations.

18. Cardio Fun for Kids

- o Awarded \$929.26
- Purchase of cardio drumming supplies. Gives students a cardio drumming experience to enhance the development of auditory skill, gross and fine motor skills and a sense of rhythm while maintaining a steady beat, body awareness, coordination and following directions.
