This year, our students achieved some of the strongest academic results in Indiana! P-H-M is ranked in the top 4% of public school corporations statewide for the second consecutive year. Northpoint and Prairie Vista Elementaries are both ranked among the Top 10 schools in Indiana. Discovery Middle School is ranked #3 in the state.

Each year, teachers from around the district submit grant proposals to the P-H-M Education Foundation to fund projects in their schools and classrooms – projects made possible by your gifts. This year, your gifts funded innovative projects like book vending machines!

A book vending machine is exactly what it sounds like: it's a vending machine that "sells" books. But, instead of buying books with money, books can only be purchased with tokens they earn for demonstrating kindness, leadership, and hard work in their school. The machine is stocked with books that are appropriate for all grade levels, so every student can enjoy the fun of popping in a token, carefully choosing exactly which buttons to push, and then watching in anticipation as the gear slowly turns to release their new treasure.





At Horizon Elementary, the book vending machine is one way the school is creating a culture that encourages reading as a life-long habit. And this work is paying off! *This year, Horizon was named the highest performing school in Indiana IREAD testing, achieving a 100% pass rate!*

Now, our teachers are preparing new grant applications for everything from classroom technology to gym equipment and items to help students whose families are struggling to make ends meet. Every grant request represents an opportunity to help our students, but without additional funding we will be forced to deny some of this year's grant applications.
